The Landscape Design Consultants' Council is here to help you expand your education in landscape design within private, public, and historical gardens. My theme for these two years is "Harmony in the Landscape". This theme fits well with Florida Federation of Garden Clubs (FFGC) President Al Latina's Theme: Diversity in the Garden.

As consultants we have learned the tools on how to turn every stone, dirt, plant, hardscape into a paradise. We now have to pass those skills on to our friends, neighbors, community, and the world. As I think of landscape, there is no area we do not touch (gardening/environmental) on. Ask yourself one question: How do I pass my knowledge of landscaping on or go the next step? We expand our knowledge through programs, seminars, short courses, and proctoring at NGC Schools. Meetings are worthwhile attending if we can learn one new item or solve one problem. We can learn what other organizations have to offer, and advocate for sharing those skills and knowledge with others.

Tri-Council and each Council will have 3 meetings (September and January in Winter Park, FL and April at the FFGC Convention), after the combined meetings, a speaker will provide a program. Want an advocacy program in your area or know a great topic / program / speaker, let me know, maybe we can bring it to a council meeting or have it at another location.

The Unsolicited Landscape Design Award is an outstanding program to recognize and encourage well-designed and maintained plantings in the public sector. Consultants or garden members nominate a public/private facility, or private residence who have an outstanding landscape design. Those nominations go before a district panel to award the best landscape design within a district. For this program to work, I will need your help. I am soliciting LDC to step up and take charge of the Unsolicited Landscape Design Award program within their Districts. If you are interested in chairing or being on the panel to select these winners in your community, please contact me.

Are you aware of the Florida Statutes 373.185 <http://m.flsenate.gov/Statutes/373.185> and 720.3075(4)(a) <http://m.flsenate.gov/Statutes/720.3075> on Florida-friendly landscaping ordinances? Research these statutes so you can be the advocate between homeowners and their community Homeowners' Association on prevention measures to conserve or protect the state's water resources by planting landscaping using Florida-friendly plants.

We can take trash and turn the item into a treasure for someone. I am looking for ideas on how to recycle items and would like to share them with other consultants.

UNSOLICITED LANDSCAPE DESIGN AWARDS” FOR PLANTINGS IN THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTOR

This project was planned to involve all consultants of the Landscape Design School for the purpose of recognizing and encouraging well-designed and maintained plantings in the public sector. The awards are not requested or submitted by businesses/ facilities/residents.

Categories eligible for nominations are:

1. Small businesses (such as gas stations, fast food, etc.)
2. Public facility (such as library, park, police station, etc.)
3. Private facility (such as church, hospital, etc.)
4. Private Residence of Merit.

The Unsolicited Landscape Design Award Entry Form(s) are submitted by any National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NGC) Member, especially graduates from the NGC Landscape Design School (LDS). They may nominate any well-designed and maintained landscape area in the public sector in her/his District.

Guidelines:

1. All landscaping must have been completed for at least one year.
2. All landscaping must be viewed from the street.
3. Garden member will submit Entry Form with photo(s) to their FFGC District Director or District Landscape Design Chairperson by March 1st.
4. The FFGC District Director or District Landscape Design Chairperson will select a panel of judges, made up of members from FFGC Tri-Council LDCC members or members who have completed the NGC LDS within her/his district to evaluate the categories nominated. Contact LDCC President or FFGC LDS Chairman for names. Other interested NGC Gardening Members may participate on the panel.

*The panel will use NGC Landscape Design School Standards, LDS Form 14, Standards for Evaluating Landscape Design for point scoring. Each LDS Form 14 must accompany each nomination. Download NGC form:

*District Directors will present Winners Certificates at the Spring District Meeting to the winning Garden Club and Winner. Certificates are available from the President of the Landscape Design Consultants' Council.

5. FFGC District Director will submit winner's name and paperwork in each category to Landscape Design Consultants' Council President by April 1st.

HISTORY OF TRI-COUNCIL OF FFGC

On January 10, 2008, six members of the Florida Federation of Garden Clubs, Inc. met at the home of Pat Carver at Dade City. Present were Carolyn Schaag, Past President of FFGC and President of Gardening Consultants' Council; Darcy Stottlemeyer, President of Landscape Design Consultants' Council; Pat Carver, President of Environmental Consultants' Council; Joan Pryor, Past President of FFGC; Sue Angle, 3rd Vice President of FFGC; and Jayne Hemstreet, State Schools Chairman.

The goal of the meeting was to bring the three Consultants' Councils together for the purpose of sharing meeting time before FFGC Board Meetings three times a year, publishing a joint yearbook, promotion of education, publishing a joint newsletter, sharing common projects, and building stronger organizations.

The decision was made the group would be named Tri-Council and would be led by a Tri-Council President. All Presidents and Vice Presidents would serve a two-year term, concurrent with the FFGC President, and each President would appoint other Tri-Council officers.

The first joint meeting was held on January 16, 2008, with Carolyn Schaag presiding. The recommendation was presented and approved and the Tri-Council became a reality.

On September 10, 2014 members adopted Bylaws naming the Tri-Council of FFGC, stating the objectives, listing qualifications for membership, establishing the offices of President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer as elected positions for a two-year term, listing duties of the Officers, and regulations on finances, meetings, and committees. The three Consultant Councils adopted new Bylaws at this same meeting which eliminated a secretary, a treasurer, and a separate bank account for each of the Councils and established a Tri-Council secretary, treasurer, and one bank account that would serve the organization starting with the 2015-2017 administration.

On September 14, 2014, Tri-Council of FFGC adopted Standing Rules creating the FFGC Tri-Consultant and FFGC Master Tri-Consultant status to recognize those who have completed all three schools. The first award certificates and pins were presented on April 19, 2015 at the FFGC Convention in Boca Raton, Florida. Florida is the only state in the US known to have this status.

At the September 12, 2018 meeting the Tri-Council adopted a Standing Rule to annually sponsor camperships with whole or partial funding for children, grand children, and great grandchildren of a Tri-Council member to attend Wekiva Youth Camp or the SEEK Conference.

CONSULTANT CLASSIFICATIONS

(Applies to each Consultant Council)

PROVISIONAL CONSULTANT

A student who attends any two courses of school and takes and passes the exams is considered a Provisional Consultant and is eligible to join a Consultants Council. Provisional Consultant status is retained until the successful completion of all four courses of a school, passing the exams and becoming a Consultant. NGC allows seven (7) years to complete a school since the first course was taken and all credit lapses.

CONSULTANT

A Provisional Consultant who completes all four courses of a school, passes the necessary exams, is a member of a NGC affiliated garden club, and subscribes to The National Gardener can become a Consultant. The Consultant may not refresh in the SAME year they become a consultant, but can refresh once a CALENDAR year thereafter and must refresh by the end of the fifth (5) calendar year after their last refresher or completion of the school.

MASTER CONSULTANT

A consultant may be designated a “Master” Consultant after completing four (4) recorded Refreshers, is a member of a NGC affiliated garden club, and subscribes to The National Gardener. The consultant must personally request the Master status from the NGC Accrediting Chairman. To maintain the Master status, the member must refresh at currently specified periods as often as once each calendar year and by the end of the fifth calendar year after the last refresher. Master Consultants in all three schools can refresh for all three by attending any Tri-Refresher offered by any NGC garden club.

EMERITUS

A Master consultant in good standing can request Emeritus status. The Master consultant must personally request this status through the State School Chairman.
