ELIGIBILITY

A. Only Florida Federation of Garden Clubs members are eligible to apply for FFGC awards unless otherwise stated in the award description. Members are defined as a member garden clubs/circles, groups of member clubs, and individual members of garden clubs. Junior, Intermediate, High School Garden Clubs, Individual Youth must be sponsored by a member garden club to be eligible for specific FFGC and NGC awards.

The award application form is a single page; however, you may submit up to two additional pages (the application plus two pages, front only), if required to answer the questions. That space includes images, as well. That single page is referred to as page one in this document.
